The Summer Institute is an opportunity for formerly incarcerated individuals and resource/service providers to unite, share, and create partnerships to improve the reentry process for returning citizens.

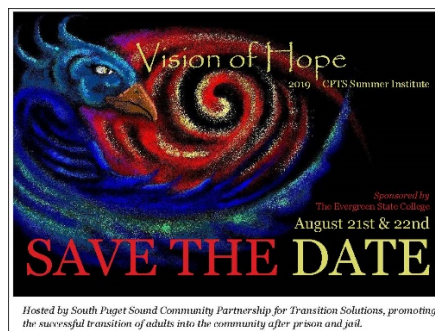
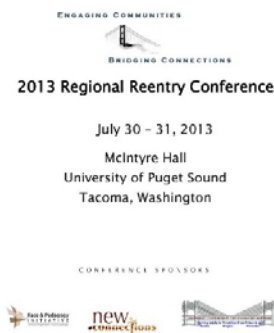
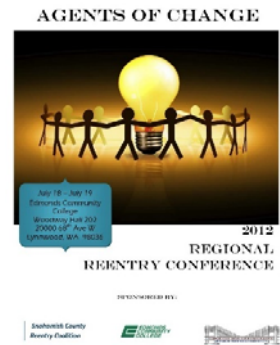
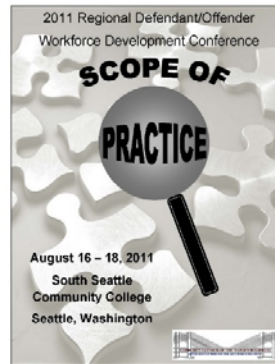
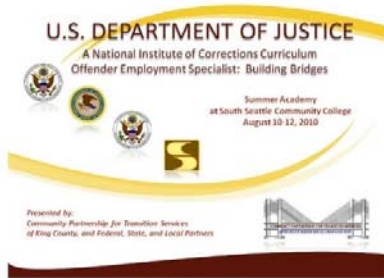
