Below is a list of the bills we looked at with a hyperlink to the Washington State Legislatures page for each bill so you can get more information.</p> <p>HB 1169: Concerning legal financial obligations.</p> <p>HB 1189: Concerning the release of incarcerated individuals from total confinement prior to the expiration of a sentence.</p> <p>HB 1268: Concerning sentencing enhancements.</p> <p>HB 1324: Concerning the scoring of prior juvenile offenses in sentencing range calculations.</p> <p>HB 1394: Creating a developmentally appropriate response to youth who commit sexual offenses.</p> <p>HB 1541: Establishing the nothing about us without us act.</p> <p>HB 1562: Reducing the risks of lethality and other harm associated with gun violence, gender-based violence, and other types of violence.</p> <p>SB 5046: Concerning postconviction access to counsel.</p> <p>SB 5131: Concerning money received by the department of corrections on behalf of inmates from family or other outside sources for the purchase of commissary items.</p> <p>SB 5134: Concerning reentry services and supports.</p> <p>SB 5536: Concerning controlled substances, counterfeit substances, and legend drug possession and treatment.</p>
